AN ACT

To amend the State Department Basic Authorities Act of 1956 to provide for the establishment and maintenance of existing libraries and resource centers at United States diplomatic and consular missions to provide information about American culture, society, and history, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 4 This Act may be cited at as the "Public Diplomacy
- 5 Resource Centers Act of 20072008".

(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of State shall ensure that libraries and resource centers established and maintained in accordance with subparagraph (F) of section 1(b)(3) of the State Department Basic Authorities Act of 1956 (as added by section 2(a)(3) of this Act) are open to the general public to the greatest extent practicable, subject to policies and procedures established by the Secretary to ensure the safety and security of United States diplomatic and consular missions and of United

- States officers, employees, and personnel posted at such missions at which such libraries are located.
- 3 (2) Johnny Grant Film Seriesshowings of
 4 American films.—The To the extent practicable, the
 5 Secretary of State shall ensure that such libraries
 6 and resource centers schedule public showings of
 7 American films that showcase American culture, so8 ciety, values, and history. Such public showings shall

be known as the "Johnny Grant Film Series".

- 10 (e) RECEIPT OF DONATIONS.—The Secretary of
 11 State may accept donations that are made to the libraries
 12 and resource centers authorized under this Act if the Sec13 retary determines that such receipt will not result in any
 14 cost to the Federal Government.
- 14 15 (d)(c) Advisory Commission on Public Diplo-MACY.—The Not later than one year after the date of the 16 enactment of this Act, the Advisory Commission on Public Diplomacy (authorized under section 1334 of the Foreign Affairs Reform and Restructuring Act of 1998 (22 U.S.C. 19 20 6553)) shall submit to the Committee on Foreign Affairs 21 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Foreign Relations of the Senate a report containing and an evaluation of the functions and effectiveness of the libraries and resource centers that are authorized under this 25 Act.
