A BILL

To give the consent of Congress to an agreement or compact between Alabama, Florida, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas for the purpose of establishing an all-hazard mitigation, readiness, response, and recovery plan, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Gulf Coast All-Hazard
5 Readiness Act of 2007”.

1 **SEC. 2. CONSENT OF CONGRESS.**

2 (a) CONSENT.—The consent of Congress is given to
3 any number of the Gulf Coast States to negotiate and
4 enter into an agreement or compact that meets the fol-
5 lowing requirements:

6 (1) The agreement or compact is consented to
7 by the legislatures of each of the participating Gulf
8 Coast States through legislation enacted not later
9 than December 31, 2010.

10 (2) The agreement or compact is entered into
11 primarily for the purpose of establishing a plan for
12 all-hazard mitigation, readiness, response, and recov-
13 ery.

14 (3) The agreement or compact establishes a
15 multi-state all-hazard fund generated by partici-
16 pating Gulf Coast States to be utilized when a dis-
17 aster affects those States.

18 (4) The agreement or compact requires each of
19 the participating Gulf Coast States to appoint a
20 commissioner to organize the operation, manage-
21 ment, and disbursement of the multi-state all-hazard
22 fund in coordination with the other commissioners.

23 (5) The agreement or compact prohibits partici-
24 pating Gulf Coast States from taking an action pro-
25 hibited by Federal law at the time of such action.

1 (b) GULF COAST STATES DEFINED.—As used in this
2 section, the term “Gulf Coast States” means Alabama,
3 Florida, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas.
