A BILL

To repeal and modify certain provisions of law relating to
the review of the detention of enemy combatants.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REPEAL AND MODIFICATION OF CERTAIN PRO-**
4 **VISIONS RELATING TO REVIEW OF DETEN-**
5 **TION OF ENEMY COMBATANTS.**

6 (a) REPEAL OF LIMITATION ON JUDICIAL REVIEW
7 OF DETENTION OF ENEMY COMBATANTS.—Section 2241
8 of title 28, United States Code, is amended by striking
9 subsection (e).

1 (b) REPEAL OF REVIEW OF DECISIONS OF COMBAT-
2 ANT STATUS REVIEW TRIBUNALS OF PROPRIETY OF DE-
3 TENTION.—Section 1005(e) of the Detainee Treatment
4 Act of 2005 (Public Law 109–148; 10 U.S.C. 801 note)
5 and section 1405(e) of the Detainee Treatment Act of
6 2005 (Public Law 109–163; 10 U.S.C. 801 note) are each
7 amended by striking paragraph (2).

8 (c) MODIFICATION OF REVIEW OF MILITARY COM-
9 MISSION PROCEDURES AND ACTIONS.—Section 950j of
10 title 10, United States Code, is amended by striking sub-
11 section (b) and inserting the following:

12 “(b) LIMITED REVIEW OF MILITARY COMMISSION
13 PROCEDURES AND ACTIONS.—Except as otherwise pro-
14 vided in this chapter or in section 2241 of title 28 or any
15 other habeas corpus provision, and notwithstanding any
16 other provision of law, no court, justice, or judge shall
17 have jurisdiction to hear or consider any claim or cause
18 of action whatsoever, including any action pending on or
19 filed after the date of the enactment of the Military Com-
20 missions Act of 2006, relating to the prosecution, trial,
21 or judgment of a military commission under this chapter,
22 including challenges to the lawfulness of procedures of
23 military commissions under this chapter.”.
