- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "English Language In-

8	(b) Expanded National Activities.—Section
9	3131 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of
10	1965 (20 U.S.C. 6861) is amended—
11	(1) by striking "(in consortia with State edu-
12	cational agencies or local educational agencies)"
13	after "institutions of higher learning" and inserting
14	", State educational agencies, local educational agen-
15	cies, and consortia of local educational agencies";
16	(2) by striking "and" at the end of paragraph
17	(2);
18	(3) by striking the period at the end of para-
19	graph (3) and inserting a semicolon; and
20	(4) by inserting after paragraph (3) the fol-
