# H. R. 2962

To designate Pakistan under section 244 of the Immigration and Nationality Act to permit nationals of Pakistan to be eligible for temporary protected status under such sections.

## A BILL

To designate Pakistan under section 244 of the Immigration and Nationality Act to permit nationals of Pakistan to be eligible for temporary protected status under such sections.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Pakistani Temporary
- 5 Protected Status Act of 2007".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds the following:

- 1 (1) On October 8, 2005, a magnitude 7.6 earth-2 quake struck Pakistan.
  - (2) In Pakistan, more than 73,000 people have been killed as a result of this earthquake.
  - (3) Immediately following the earthquake, nearly 3 million people were living in tents or in the open air amid freezing temperatures, having been left homeless by the earthquake.
  - (4) The earthquake damaged sanitation systems in the region, destroyed hospitals, and left many victims with no access to clean drinking water, making them more vulnerable to disease.
  - (5) One year after the devastating 7.6 magnitude earthquake that killed some 80,000 people in northern Pakistan and Kashmir, more than 400,000 people were still without permanent shelter.
  - (6) Temporary protected status allows aliens who do not legally qualify as refugees but are none-theless fleeing or reluctant to return to potentially dangerous situations to temporarily remain in the United States.
  - (7) Granting temporary protected status to nationals of Pakistan is consistent with the interests of the United States and promotes the values and morals that have made the United States strong.

### 1 SEC. 3. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

- 2 It is the sense of Congress that the extraordinary and
- 3 temporary conditions caused by the earthquake in Paki-
- 4 stan qualifies Pakistan for designation under subpara-
- 5 graphs (B) or (C) of section 244(b)(1) of the Immigration
- 6 and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1254a(b)(1)), pursuant to
- 7 which nationals of Pakistan would be eligible for tem-
- 8 porary protected status in the United States.

### 9 SEC. 4. DESIGNATION FOR PURPOSES OF GRANTING TEM-

- 10 PORARY PROTECTED STATUS.
- 11 (a) Designation.—
- 12 (1) In General.—For purposes of section 244
- of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
- 14 1254a), Pakistan shall be treated as if it had been
- designated under subsection (b) of such section, sub-
- ject to the provisions of this section.
- 17 (2) Period of Designation.—The initial pe-
- riod of such designation shall begin on the date of
- the enactment of this Act and shall remain in effect
- for 12 months.
- 21 (b) ALIENS ELIGIBLE.—In applying section 244 of
- 22 such Act pursuant to the designation made under this sec-
- 23 tion, subject to section 244(c)(3) of such Act, an alien who
- 24 is a national of Pakistan is deemed to satisfy the require-
- 25 ments of section 244(c)(1) of such Act only if the alien—

- 1 (1) has been continuously physically present in 2 the United States since October 8, 2005;
- 3 (2) is admissible as an immigrant, except as 4 otherwise provided under section 244(c)(2)(A) of 5 such Act, and is not ineligible for temporary pro-6 tected status under section 244(c)(2)(B) of such 7 Act; and
- 8 (3) registers for temporary protected status in 9 a manner that the Secretary of Homeland Security 10 shall establish.
- 11 (c) Consent To Travel Abroad.—The Secretary 12 of Homeland Security shall give the prior consent to travel abroad described in section 244(f)(3) of such Act to an alien who is granted temporary protected status pursuant 14 15 to the designation made under this section, if the alien establishes to the satisfaction of the Secretary of Home-16 land Security that emergency and extenuating circumstances beyond the control of the alien require the 18 19 alien to depart for a brief, temporary trip abroad. An alien returning to the United States in accordance with such 21 an authorization shall be treated the same as any other returning alien provided temporary protected status under 23 section 244 of such Act.
