1 **SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON USE OF PAROLE POWER TO**
2 **PROVIDE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO ALIENS**
3 **AT A BORDER.**

4 Section 212(d)(5) of the Immigration and Nationality
5 Act (8 U.S.C. 1182(d)(5)) is amended by adding at the
6 end the following:

7 “(C) The Secretary of Homeland Security may not
8 parole into the United States an alien solely because the
9 alien—

10 “(i) falls ill while seeking admission, or waiting
11 to seek admission, at a port of entry into the United
12 States; or

13 “(ii) approaches an agent or official of the De-
14 partment of Homeland Security at or near the bor-
15 der in order to seek emergency medical assistance.”.
