Mr. SMITH of New Jersey (for himself, Mr. HOLT, Mr. SAXTON, and Mr. PALLONE) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

# A BILL

To condition the transfer of personnel and functions from Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, pursuant to the base closure process.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. CONDITIONS ON FUNDING TRANSFER OF PER-  
4 SONNEL AND FUNCTIONS FROM FORT MON-  
5 MOUTH, NEW JERSEY.

6 (a) CONDITIONS.—The Secretary of Defense or the  
7 Secretary of the Army shall not fund the transfer of per-  
8 sonnel or functions from Fort Monmouth, New Jersey,  
9 pursuant to the recommendations of the Defense Base

1 Closure and Realignment Commission contained in the re-  
2 port transmitted to Congress on September 15, 2005,  
3 under section 2903(e) of the Defense Base Closure and  
4 Realignment Act of 1990 (part A of title **XXIX** of Public  
5 Law 101–510; 10 U.S.C. 2687 note) until at least 30 days  
6 after the date on which the Comptroller General completes  
7 an audit of a report of the Secretary of Defense stating  
8 that the movement of organizations, functions, or activi-  
9 ties from Fort Monmouth to Aberdeen Proving Ground  
10 will be accomplished without disruption of their support  
11 to the Global War on Terror or other critical contingency  
12 operations and that safeguards exist to ensure that nec-  
13 essary redundant capabilities are put in place to mitigate  
14 potential degradation of such support and to ensure max-  
15 imum retention of critical workforce, as required by the  
16 Commission recommendations.

17 (b) SUBMISSION OF REPORT.—The report and audit  
18 referred to in subsection (a) shall be submitted to the  
19 Committee on Armed Services of the House of Represent-  
20 atives, the Committee on Appropriations of the House of  
21 Representatives, the Committee on Education and Labor  
22 of the House of Representatives, the Committee on Over-  
23 sight and Government Reform of the House of Represent-  
24 atives, the Committee on Armed Services of the Senate,  
25 the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate, the Com-

1 mittee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions of the  
2 Senate, and the Committee on Homeland Security and  
3 Governmental Affairs of the Senate.
