A BILL

To provide funding for multi-jurisdictional anti-gang task forces.

- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

 This Act may be cited as the "Anti-Gang Task Force
 Act of 2007".

 SEC. 2. ASSISTANCE FOR MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL ANTIGANG TASK FORCES.

 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General, in con-

- ties, for the coordinated investigation, disruption,
 apprehension, and prosecution of criminal gangs and
 offenders;

 - (3) provide all necessary funding for the operation of the task force; and
 - (4) provide all necessary funding for national and regional meetings of task forces, and all other related organizations, as needed, to ensure effective operation of such teams through the sharing of intelligence, best practices and for any other related purpose.
- 18 (b) Membership.—The task forces shall consist of 19 agents and officers, where feasible, from—
- 20 (1) the Federal Bureau of Investigation;
- 21 (2) the Drug Enforcement Administration;
- (3) the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms,and Explosives;
