Mr. CROWLEY (for himself and Mr. LoBIONDO) introduced the following bill;
which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To clarify the tariff classification of certain fiberboard core
and laminate boards and panels.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. HIGH DENSITY FIBERBOARD.**

4 (a) FINDING.—Congress finds that Chapter 44 of the
5 Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States was
6 amended effective February 3, 2007, by inserting lan-
7 guage specifically describing laminate boards in, among
8 other sections, subheadings 4411.12.20, 4411.13.20, and
9 4411.14.20 as laminate boards bonded in whole or in part,
10 or impregnated, with synthetic resins.

1 (b) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION TO CERTAIN EN-
2 TRIES.—Notwithstanding section 514 of the Tariff Act of
3 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other provision of law, upon
4 proper request filed with the Bureau of Customs and Bor-
5 der Protection before the 90th day after the date of the
6 enactment of this Act, any entry, or withdrawal from
7 warehouse for consumption, of any goods which would be
8 currently described in subheadings 4411.12.20,
9 4411.13.20 or 4411.14.20, of the Harmonized Tariff
10 Schedule of the United States (as described in subsection
11 (a)) that was made—

12 (1) on or after January 1, 1994; and

13 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the en-
14 actment of this Act;

15 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though the above-
16 described amendments applied to such entry or with-
17 drawal.
