## A BILL

To amend the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 to define environmental intervention blood lead level.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Lead-Safe Housing
- 5 for Kids Act of 2007".
- 6 SEC. 2. AMENDING THE RESIDENTIAL LEAD-BASED PAINT
- 7 HAZARD REDUCTION ACT OF 1992.
- 8 Section 1017 of the Residential Lead-Based Paint
- 9 Hazard Reduction Act (42 U.S.C. 4852c) is amended—

- 1 (a) by striking "Not later than" and inserting "(a)
- 2 In General.—Not later than" with appropriate indenta-
- 3 tion; and
- 4 (b) by adding at the end the following new subsection:
- 5 "(b) Environmental Intervention Blood Lead
- 6 Level.—For the purpose of this Act, and any regulations
- 7 issued under this Act, an environmental intervention blood
- 8 lead level shall be a confirmed concentration of lead in
- 9 whole blood equal to or greater than 10 ug/dL
- 10 (micrograms of lead per deciliter) for a single test.".
- 11 SEC. 3. FEDERAL REGULATIONS.
- 12 The Secretary of Housing and Urban Development
- 13 shall amend the regulations of such department to comply
- 14 with the amendments made by section 2 not later than
- 15 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act.
