To provide for greater judicial discretion in sentencing for certain firearms offenses committed in exceptional circumstances.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. GREATER JUDICIAL DISCRETION IN SEN-4 TENCING FOR CERTAIN FIREARMS OFFENSES 5 **COMMITTED EXCEPTIONAL** IN CIR-6 CUMSTANCES. 7 Section 924(c)(1) of title 18, United States Code, is 8 amended by redesignating subparagraphs (C) and (D) as
- 9 subparagraphs (D) and (E), respectively, and inserting
- 10 after subparagraph (B) the following:

1	"(C) The minimum sentencing requirements of sub-
2	paragraphs (A) and (B) shall not apply if—
3	"(i) the person who used, carried, or possessed
4	the firearm was authorized to carry that type of fire-
5	arm in the lawful performance of an employment
6	duty;
7	"(ii) the offense under this paragraph occurred
8	during or in relation to such employment; and
9	"(iii) the crime during and in relation to which
10	the offense under this paragraph occurred is a crime
11	of violence.".
