## A BILL

To direct the Attorney General to conduct a study on the feasibility of expanding the National Incident-Based Reporting System to identify crime data relating to elementary and secondary schools.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Accurate Crime Trends  
5 for Schools Act”, or the “ACT for Schools Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. STUDY AND REPORT.**

7 (a) STUDY.—The Attorney General shall, in consulta-  
8 tion with the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investiga-

1 tion and the International Association of Chiefs of Police,  
2 conduct a study to determine the feasibility of expanding  
3 the National Incident-Based Reporting System to include  
4 information on the occurrence of school-related crime in  
5 elementary and secondary schools. Such study shall in-  
6 clude the identification and evaluation of methods that  
7 may be used to collect and report such information.

8 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 6 months after the date  
9 of the enactment of this Act, the Attorney General shall  
10 report the results of the study conducted under subsection  
11 (a) to the appropriate committees of Congress.
