## A BILL

- To direct the Attorney General to conduct a study on the feasibility of expanding the National Incident-Based Reporting System to identify crime data relating to elementary and secondary schools.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Accurate Crime Trends
  - 5 for Schools Act", or the "ACT for Schools Act".
  - 6 SEC. 2. STUDY AND REPORT.
  - 7 (a) Study.—The Attorney General shall, in consulta-
  - 8 tion with the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investiga-

- 1 tion and the International Association of Chiefs of Police,
- 2 conduct a study to determine the feasibility of expanding
- 3 the National Incident-Based Reporting System to include
- 4 information on the occurrence of school-related crime in
- 5 elementary and secondary schools. Such study shall in-
- 6 clude the identification and evaluation of methods that
- 7 may be used to collect and report such information.
- 8 (b) Report.—Not later than 6 months after the date
- 9 of the enactment of this Act, the Attorney General shall
- 10 report the results of the study conducted under subsection
- 11 (a) to the appropriate committees of Congress.
