A BILL

To suspend the effectiveness of certain regulations relating to the penny, and the authority to prescribe such regulations, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Coinage Efficiency Act
- 5 of 2007".
- 6 SEC. 2. SUSPENSION OF REGULATORY AUTHORITY.
- 7 (a) In General.—The regulations prescribed by the
- 8 Director of the United States Mint, pursuant to a delega-
- 9 tion by the Secretary of the Treasury of the Secretary's
- 10 authority under section 5111(d) of title 31, United States

- 1 Code, as published in final form in the Federal Register
- 2 on April 16, 2007 (Vol. 72, No. 72, page 18880, et seq.),
- 3 and codified as part 82 of chapter 1 of subtitle B of title
- 4 31, Code of Federal Regulations, shall cease to apply as
- 5 of the date of the enactment of this Act, and shall have
- 6 no force or effect after such date, with respect to 1-cent
- 7 coins.
- 8 (b) Suspension of Prospective Regulations.—
- 9 The Secretary of the Treasury shall have no authority to
- 10 prescribe any regulations under section 5111(d) of title
- 11 31, United States Code, that would limit or prohibit the
- 12 export, melting, or treatment of the 1-cent coin during the
- 13 period beginning on the date of the enactment of this Act
- 14 and ending on the date when the Secretary first issues
- 15 a 1-cent coin with a different metallic content than the
- 16 1-cent coins issued as of such date of enactment.
- 17 (c) No Effect on Other Coins.—No provision of
- 18 this section shall be construed as affecting—
- 19 (1) the applicability of the regulations referred
- to in subsection (a) to coins other than the 1-cent
- 21 coin; or
- 22 (2) the authority of the Secretary of the Treas-
- 23 ury to prescribe regulations under section 5111(d) of

- 1 title 31, United States Code, with respect to coins
- 2 other than the 1-cent coin.
