Mr. BOOZMAN introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to increase the number of outpatient visits for mental health care that do not require preauthorization for dependents of certain members of the Armed Forces.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Christopher Van Der

5 Horn Military Survivors Mental Health Access Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. INCREASE IN MENTAL HEALTH CARE VISITS BY DE-**
2 **PENDENTS OF CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE**
3 **ARMED FORCES.**

4 (a) INCREASE.—Section 1079(i) of title 10, United
5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
6 lowing new paragraph:

7 “(4)(A) With respect to outpatient mental health
8 services for dependents described in subparagraph (B),
9 preadmission authorization is not required for the first 16
10 visits.

11 “(B) Subparagraph (A) applies to outpatient mental
12 health services for a dependent of a member of the armed
13 forces who died while eligible to receive hostile fire pay
14 under section 310 of title 37 or from a disease or injury
15 incurred while eligible for such pay.”.

16 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—Paragraph (4) of section
17 1079(i) of title 10, United States Code, as added by sub-
18 section (a), shall apply to dependents of members of the
19 Armed Forces described in subparagraph (B) of that para-
20 graph who died on or after September 11, 2001.

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
