A BILL

- To amend the Ethics in Government Act of 1978 to prevent Government officials from accepting travel from persons having business before their agencies, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Restoring Trust in
 - 5 Public Officials Act of 2007".

1	SEC. 2. ACCEPTANCE OF TRAVEL BY GOVERNMENT OFFI-
2	CIALS.
3	The Ethics in Government Act of 1978 is amended
4	by adding at the end the following:
5	"TITLE VI—ACCEPTANCE OF
6	TRAVEL BY GOVERNMENT OF-
7	FICIALS
8	"SEC. 601. ACCEPTANCE OF CERTAIN TRAVEL BY CERTAIN
9	GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS PROHIBITED.
10	"(a) Generally.—A covered official shall not accept
11	any travel paid for by a prohibited source. Nor shall an
12	agency accept a payment for travel that a covered official
13	may not accept under this section.
14	"(b) Sanctions.—The prohibition of this title shall
15	be enforced in the same manner as the prohibitions of title
16	V, and a violation of a prohibition of this title shall be
17	subject to the same sanctions as a violation of that title.
18	"(c) Definitions.—In this title—
19	"(1) the term 'covered official' means a person
20	described in section 207(c)(2)(A) of title 18, United
21	States Code; and
22	"(2) the term 'prohibited source' means any
23	person who—
24	"(A) is seeking official action by the cov-
25	ered official's agency:

1	"(B) does business or seeks to do business
2	with the covered official's agency;
3	"(C) conducts activities regulated by the
4	covered official's agency;
5	"(D) has interests that may be substan-
6	tially affected by the performance or non-
7	performance of the covered official's official du-
8	ties; or
9	"(E) is an organization a majority of
10	whose members are described in any of para-
11	graphs (A) through (D).".
12	SEC. 3. CONFORMING AMENDMENT TO TITLE 31, UNITED
13	STATES CODE.
14	Section 1353(a) of title 31, United States Code, is
15	amended by inserting ", consistent with title VI of the
16	Ethics in Government Act of 1978," after "shall prescribe
17	by regulation"
