Mr. Lantos introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To prevent the admission of any member or leader of the Magyar Garda into the United States, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
- 4 The Congress finds the following:
- 5 (1) In August 2007, Gabor Vona, President of
- 6 JOBBIK, the Right-Wing Youth Community Party,
- 7 announced plans to establish a a new paramilitary
- 8 organization, the "Hungarian Guard", or Magyar
- 9 Garda, with an aim to provide "physical and intel-
- 10 lectual defense for Hungarians".

- 1 (2) Jewish groups in Hungary have raised con-2 cerns of rising anti-Semitism, expressing particular 3 concern about the Magyar Garda's use of symbols 4 linked to the Arrow Cross party that collaborated 5 with the Nazis in World War II.
 - (3) The fascist Arrow Cross regime was responsible for the deportation of some 450,000 Hungarian Jews to Nazi death camps where many died in the Holocaust.
 - (4) The World Jewish Congress has called on the Hungarian Government to act against the Magyar Garda.
 - (5) On August 25, 2007, 56 members of the Magyar Garda were sworn in during a ceremony in Budapest's historic castle district.
 - (6) On October 26, 2007, 600 new members were inducted into the Magyar Garda at Hero's Square in Budapest before a crowd of 2500. The new members were wearing the Garda's uniforms that are reminiscent of those worn by Arrow Cross members.
 - (7) The Magyar Garda has announced its intention "to rescue Hungarians", preserve "Hungary for Hungarians", and train its members to use firearms and weaponry.

3	(a) In General.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
4	sion of law, a consular officer shall deny all classes of im-
5	migrant and nonimmigrant visas to, and the Secretary of
6	Homeland Security shall deny admission into the United
7	States to, any alien who the Secretary of State determines
8	is or was—
9	(1) a former or present leader of the Magyar
10	Garda;
11	(2) a present member of the Magyar Garda; or
12	(3) a member of the immediate family of an in-
13	dividual described in paragraph (1) or (2).
14	(b) WAIVER.—The President may waive the applica-
15	tion of subsection (a) on a case-by-case basis only if the
16	President determines and certifies in writing to the Com-
17	mittee on Foreign Affairs and the Committee on the Judi-
18	ciary of the House of Representatives and the Committee
19	on Foreign Relations and the Committee on the Judiciary
20	of the Senate that the admission of a specified alien is
