A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to carry out a pilot program to provide mental health services to certain veterans of Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Rural Veterans Health
- 3 Care Access Act of 2007".
- SEC. 2. FINDINGS. 4
- 5 Congress finds the following:
- 6 (1) One out of every six veterans who have re-7 turned from serving in Operation Enduring Freedom 8 or Operation Iraqi Freedom have diagnosable post-
- 9 traumatic stress disorder.
- 10 (2) The Department of Veterans Affairs and 11 the Department of Defense face a shortfall of 12 trained mental health professionals.
- 13 (3) The demands placed on the Department of 14 Veterans Affairs health care system exceed the ca-15 pacity of that system to serve veterans.
 - (4) Veterans who live in rural areas serviced by distant Department of Veterans Affairs facilities have no option other than excessive travel for diagnosis and long-term treatment.
- 20 (5) The variety of mental ailments acquired during or as a result of deployment in a war zone 22 frequently require long-term, intensive, and highly-23 personalized care.
 - (6) The system of the Veterans Health Administration of the Department of Veterans Affairs in effect as of the date of the enactment of this Act for

8	SEC. 3. PILOT PROGRAM TO PROVIDE MENTAL HEALTH
9	SERVICES TO CERTAIN VETERANS OF CON-
10	TINGENCY OPERATIONS.
11	(a) Establishment.—The Secretary of Veterans
12	Affairs shall establish and carry out a pilot program to
13	provide mental health counseling to eligible veterans at fa-
14	cilities other than medical facilities of the Department of
15	Veterans Affairs.
16	(b) Eligible Veteran.—For purposes of this sec-
17	tion, the term "eligible veteran" means a veteran who—
18	(1) served on active duty in support of a contin-
19	gency operation, as that term is defined in section
20	101(13) of title 10, United States Code;
21	(2) is eligible to receive hospital care and med-
22	ical services under section 1710 of title 38, United
23	States Code;
24	(3) has been diagnosed with a mental health
25	condition for which a certified mental health pro-

- vider has recommended the veteran receive mental
 health counseling; and
 - (4) resides at least 30 miles from a medical facility of the Department of Veterans Affairs that employs a full-time mental health professional.

(c) Provision of Vouchers.—

(1) Vouchers.—

- (A) SIX MONTH SUPPLY.—Under the pilot program established under subsection (a), upon the request of an eligible veteran, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall issue to the eligible veteran a six-month supply of vouchers that may be used to provide for full payment for counseling services provided by any mental health provider on the list established under paragraph (2).
- (B) Additional vouchers.—If a veteran receives a supply of vouchers under the preceding sentence and, not later than five months after receiving such vouchers requests an additional six-month supply of vouchers, the Secretary may issue to the veteran an additional six-month supplies of vouchers, as the Secretary determines is appropriate.

- 1 (C) DEADLINE.—The Secretary of Vet-2 erans Affairs shall issue the vouchers under this 3 paragraph not later than 30 days after the date 4 of the date on which the veteran requests the 5 vouchers.
 - (2) LIST OF SERVICE PROVIDERS.—The Secretary shall compile and maintain a list of mental health care providers, including family counseling providers, who have entered into an agreement with the Secretary to accept the vouchers issued under paragraph (1) as payment in full for visits to the provider for mental health counseling.
 - (3) COMPLIANCE WITH DEPARTMENT PROTO-COLS.—Each mental health care provider on the list maintained by the Secretary under paragraph (2) shall comply with applicable protocols of the Department of Veterans Affairs before incurring any liability on behalf of the Department for the provision of services as part of the pilot program.
- 20 (d) Family Counseling.—If a certified mental 21 health provider or the Secretary of Veterans Affairs has 22 recommended that an eligible veteran and the veteran's 23 family receive family counseling, that veteran may use a 24 voucher provided under subsection (c) as payment in full 25 for visits to a family counseling provider on the list main-

- 3 (e) Rate of Provider Reimbursement.—The
- 4 Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall provide for payment
- 5 under the voucher of a mental health provider at the reim-
- 6 bursement rate (if any) in effect under the TRICARE pro-
- 7 gram under chapter 55, of title 10, United States Code,
- 8 for such services (or similar services) of such a provider
- 9 in the area or, in the absence of such a reimbursement
- 10 rate, at the payment rates for such services (or similar
- 11 services) in effect under part B of title XVIII of the Social
- 12 Security Act. In order to receive payment under a voucher,
- 13 a mental health provider shall submit to the Secretary the
- 14 voucher bearing the signature of the provider and the vet-
- 15 eran who received counseling from the provider in ex-
- 16 change for the voucher.
- 17 (f) Veterans Integrated Service Networks.—
- 18 The Secretary shall carry out the pilot program under this
- 19 section in Veterans Integrated Service Networks 1, 4, 7,
- 20 12, 17, 20, and 23.
- 21 (g) Termination; Extension.—
- 22 (1) TERMINATION.—The authority of the Secretary
- 23 to carry out a pilot program under this subsection shall
- 24 terminate on the date that is five years after the date of
- 25 enactment of this section.

- 1 (2) STUDY; EXTENSION.—Not later than four years
- 2 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
- 3 of Veterans Affairs shall conduct a study on the effective-
- 4 ness of the pilot program under this section, in which the
- 5 Secretary shall recommend whether the program should
- 6 be extended or expanded. Notwithstanding paragraph (1),
- 7 if the Secretary determines the program should be ex-
- 8 tended or expanded, the Secretary may extend or expand
- 9 the existing program.
