## A BILL

To reduce temporarily the duty on certain acrylic synthetic staple fiber.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. CERTAIN ACRYLIC SYNTHETIC STAPLE FIBER.**

4       (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of  
5       the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is  
6       amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following  
7       new heading:

“	9902.____	Acrylic fiber tow (polyacrylonitrile tow) containing by weight a minimum of 92% polyacrylonitrile, not more than .01 percent zinc and from 2 to 8 percent water, imported in the form of 8 sub-bundles, crimped together, each containing 24,000 filaments (plus or minus 10 percent) and with an average filament decitex of 4.0 to 5.6 decitex (plus or minus 10 percent), and length greater than 2 meters (provided for in subheading 5501.30.00) .....	1.2%	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2011	”.

1           (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by  
2 subsection (a) applies to articles entered, or withdrawn  
3 from warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day  
4 after the date of the enactment of this Act.
