A BILL

To promote wildland firefighter safety.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Wildland Fire Safety
- 5 and Transparency Act of 2007".
- 6 SEC. 2. WILDLAND FIREFIGHTER SAFETY.
- 7 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
- 8 (1) Secretaries.—The term "Secretaries"
- 9 means—

1	(A) the Secretary of the Interior, acting
2	through the Directors of the Bureau of Land
3	Management, the United States Fish and Wild-
4	life Service, the National Park Service, and the
5	Bureau of Indian Affairs; and
6	(B) the Secretary of Agriculture, acting
7	through the Chief of the Forest Service.
8	(2) WILDLAND FIREFIGHTER.—The term
9	"wildland firefighter" means any person who partici-
10	pates in wildland firefighting activities—
11	(A) under the direction of either of the
12	Secretaries; or
13	(B) under a contract or compact with a
14	federally recognized Indian tribe.
15	(b) Annual Report to Congress.—
16	(1) In general.—The Secretaries shall jointly
17	submit to Congress an annual report on the wildland
18	firefighter safety practices of the Secretaries, includ-
19	ing training programs and activities for wildland fire
20	suppression, prescribed burning, and wildland fire
21	use, during the preceding calendar year.
22	(2) TIMELINE.—Each report under paragraph
23	(1) shall—

1	(A) be submitted by not later than March
2	of the year following the calendar year covered
3	by the report; and
4	(B) include—
5	(i) a description of, and any changes
6	to, wildland firefighter safety practices, in-
7	cluding training programs and activities
8	for wildland fire suppression, prescribed
9	burning, and wildland fire use;
10	(ii) statistics and trend analyses;
11	(iii) an estimate of the amount of
12	Federal funds expended by the Secretaries
13	on wildland firefighter safety practices, in-
14	cluding training programs and activities
15	for wildland fire suppression, prescribed
16	burning, and wildland fire use;
17	(iv) progress made in implementing
18	recommendations from the Inspector Gen-
19	eral, the Government Accountability Office,
20	the Occupational Safety and Health Ad-
21	ministration, or an agency report relating
22	to a wildland firefighting fatality issued
23	during the preceding 10 years; and
24	(v) a description of—

1	(I) the provisions relating to
2	wildland firefighter safety practices in
3	any Federal contract or other agree-
4	ment governing the provision of
5	wildland firefighters by a non-Federal
6	entity;
7	(II) a summary of any actions
8	taken by the Secretaries to ensure
9	that the provisions relating to safety
10	practices, including training, are com-
11	plied with by the non-Federal entity;
12	and
13	(III) the results of those actions.
