Mr. WHITFIELD of Kentucky introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To amend the Tariff Act of 1930 to clarify that the anti-dumping and countervailing duty laws apply to the production of low-enriched uranium, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. PRODUCTION OF LOW-ENRICHED URANIUM.

4 (a) ANTIDUMPING DUTY.—Section 731 of the Tariff
5 Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1673) is amended in the last sen-
6 tence—

7 (1) by inserting “(a)” after “includes”; and

4 (b) COUNTERVAILING DUTY.—Section 771 of that
5 Act (19 U.S.C. 1677) is amended in paragraph (5) by
6 adding at the end the following:

7 “(G) PURCHASE OF GOODS.—For purposes
8 of subparagraphs (D)(iv) and (E)(iv) of this
9 paragraph (5), the phrases ‘purchasing goods’
10 and ‘goods are purchased’ include a contract or
11 transaction involving payment for the produc-
12 tion of low-enriched uranium.”.

13 (c) APPLICATION TO PENDING PROCEEDINGS.—The
14 amendments made by this section apply in all pending or
15 resumed antidumping and countervailing duty pro-
16 ceedings, including investigations, and in all appeals that
17 have not become final and conclusive as of the date of en-
18 actment of this Act.

19 (d) APPLICATION TO NAFTA COUNTRIES.—Pursu-
20 ant to Article 1902 of the North American Free Trade
21 Agreement and section 408 of the North American Free
22 Trade Agreement Implementation Act (19 U.S.C. 3438),
23 the amendments made by this section shall apply with re-
24 spect to goods from NAFTA countries.
