## A BILL

To require offices of the legislative branch to meet a threshold for participation by small business concerns owned and controlled by veterans with service-connected disabilities in procurement contracts entered into by such offices, and for other purposes.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Legislative Branch
- 5 Recognizes the Value of Service Disabled Veteran-Owned
- 6 Small Business Act of 2008".

- 1 on the database maintained by the Secretary of Veterans
- 2 Affairs under section 8127(f) of title 38, United States
- 3 Code, as a small business concern owned and controlled
- 4 by a veteran with a service-connected disability.
- 5 (b) SMALL BUSINESS CONCERN DEFINED.—In this
- 6 Act, the term "small business concern" has the meaning
- 7 given that term under section 3 of the Small Business Act
- 8 (15 U.S.C. 632).
- 9 SEC. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.
- This Act shall apply with respect to fiscal year 2009
- 11 and each succeeding fiscal year.
