- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Removing Impedi-
- 5 ments to Students Education Act" or the "RISE Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. REPEAL OF PROVISIONS PROHIBITING PERSONS
- 7 CONVICTED OF DRUG OFFENSES FROM RE-
- 8 CEIVING STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE.
- 9 Subsection (r) of section 484 of the Higher Edu-
- 10 cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1091(r)) is repealed.
