## A BILL

For the relief of Kumi Iizuka-Barcena.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. IMMEDIATE RELATIVE STATUS FOR KUMI**  
4       **IIZUKA-BARCENA.**

5       (a) IN GENERAL.—Kumi Iizuka-Barcena, the widow  
6       of a citizen of the United States, shall be classified as an  
7       immediate relative within the meaning of section  
8       201(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Immigration and Nationality Act  
9       for purposes of the approval of a relative visa petition filed  
10      under section 204 of such Act by her deceased spouse and  
11      the filing of an application for an immigrant visa or for  
12      adjustment of status by Kumi Iizuka-Barcena.

1       (b) ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.—If Kumi Iizuka-  
2   Barcena enters the United States before the filing dead-  
3   line specified in subsection (c), she shall be considered to  
4   have entered and remained lawfully and shall, if otherwise  
5   eligible, be eligible for adjustment of status under section  
6   245 of the Immigration and Nationality Act as of the date  
7   of the enactment of this Act.

8       (c) DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION.—Subsections (a)  
9   and (b) shall apply only if Kumi Iizuka-Barcena files an  
10   application for reconsideration of the revocation of the ap-  
11   proval of the relative visa petition referred to in subsection  
12   (a) with appropriate fees not later than 2 years after the  
13   date of the enactment of this Act.

14       (d) REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBER.—  
15   Upon the granting of an immigrant visa or permanent res-  
16   idence to Kumi Iizuka-Barcena, the Secretary of State  
17   shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by 1, for the  
18   current or next following fiscal year, the worldwide level  
19   of family-sponsored immigrants under section  
20   201(c)(1)(A) of the Immigration and Nationality Act.
