Mr. Gordon of Tennessee (for himself, Mr. Whitfield of Kentucky, and Mr. Matheson) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To prohibit the importation of certain low-level radioactive waste into the United States.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PROHIBITION OF IMPORTATION.
- 4 (a) AMENDMENT.—Chapter 8 of the Atomic Energy
- 5 Act of 1954 (42 U.S.C. 2111 et seq.) is amended by add-
- 6 ing at the end the following new section:
- 7 "Sec. 85. Importation of Low-Level Radio-
- 8 ACTIVE WASTE.

- 1 "a. Except as provided in subsection b. or c., the 2 Commission shall not issue a license authorizing the importation into the United States of— 3 "(1) low-level radioactive waste (as defined in 4 5 section 2 of the Low-Level Radioactive Waste Policy 6 Act (42 U.S.C. 2021b)); or "(2) specific radioactive waste streams exempt-7 8 ed from regulation by the Commission under section 9 10 of the Low-Level Radioactive Waste Policy Act (42 U.S.C. 2021j). 10 "b. Subsection a. shall not apply to— 11 12 "(1) low-level radioactive waste being returned 13 to a United States Government or military facility 14 which is authorized to possess the material; or "(2) low-level radioactive waste resulting from 15 16 the use in a foreign country of nuclear material ob-17 tained by the foreign user from an entity in the 18 United States that is being returned to the United
- 20 "c. The President may waive the prohibition under

States for management and disposal.

- 21 this section and authorize the grant of a specific license
- 22 to import materials prohibited under subsection a., under
- 23 the rules of the Commission, only after a finding that such
- 24 importation would meet an important national or inter-
- 25 national policy goal, such as the use of waste for research

- 1 purposes. Such a waiver must specify the policy goal to
- 2 be achieved, how it is to be achieved, and the amount of
- 3 material to be imported.
- 4 "d. A license not permitted under this section that
- 5 was issued before the date of enactment of this section
- 6 may continue in effect according to its terms, but may
- 7 not be extended or amended with respect to the amount
- 8 of material permitted to be imported.".
- 9 (b) Table of Contents Amendment.—The table
- 10 of contents for the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 is amended
- 11 by inserting at the end of the items relating to chapter
- 12 8 the following new item:

"Sec. 85. Importation of low-level radioactive waste.".
