5	The time limitations specified in section 6248(a) of
6	title 10, United States Code, shall not apply with respect
7	to the posthumous award of the Medal of Honor under
8	section 6241 of such title to Doris Miller (service number
9	356-12-35) for acts of heroism during World War II
10	while a member of the United States Navy.
