A BILL

To amend the Adams National Historical Park Act of 1998 to include the Quincy Homestead within the boundary of the Adams National Historical Park, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; FINDINGS.**

4 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the
5 “Adams National Historical Park Boundary Addition Act
6 of 2007”.

7 (b) FINDING.—The Quincy Homestead has been des-
8 ignated a National Historic Landmark.

1 **SEC. 2. ADDITION TO ADAMS NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK.**

2 Section 4(b) of the Adams National Historical Park
3 Act of 1998 (16 U.S.C. 410eee–2(b)) is amended—

4 (1) by redesignating paragraph (2) as para-
5 graph (3); and

6 (2) by adding after paragraph (1) the following
7 new paragraph:

8 “(2) The property at 34 Butler Road in Quin-
9 cy, Massachusetts, known as the Quincy Homestead
10 and carriage shed, consisting of approximately 1.8
11 acres, as generally depicted on the map entitled
12 ‘Boundary Addition Adams National Historical
13 Park’, numbered N.E.R.R.D. 386/80,001, and dated
14 August, 2003.”.
