AN ACT

To provide for a study of options for protecting the open space characteristics of certain lands in and adjacent to the Arapaho and Roosevelt National Forests in Colorado, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; FINDINGS; PURPOSE.
- 4 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be eited as the
- 5 "Colorado Northern Front Range Mountain Backdrop
- 6 Protection Study Act".
- 7 (b) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

- (1) Rising dramatically from the Great Plains, the Front Range of the Rocky Mountains provides a scenie mountain backdrop to many communities in the Denver metropolitan area and elsewhere in Colorado. The portion of the range within and adjacent to the Arapaho and Roosevelt National Forests also includes a diverse array of wildlife habitats and provides many opportunities for outdoor recreation.
 - (2) The open space character of this mountain backdrop is an important esthetic and economic asset for adjoining communities, making them attractive locations for homes and businesses.
 - (3) Rapid population growth in the northern Front Range area of Colorado is increasing recreational use of the Arapaho and Roosevelt National Forests and is also placing increased pressure for development of other lands within and adjacent to that national forest.
 - (4) Efforts by local governments and other entities have provided important protection for portions of this mountain backdrop, especially in the northern Denver metropolitan area. However, some portions of the mountain backdrop in this part of Colorado remain unprotected and are at risk of losing their open space qualities.

1	(5) It is in the national interest for the Federal

3	to assist in identifying options for increasing the
4	protection of the mountain backdrop in the northern
5	Front Range area of Colorado.
6	(e) Purpose.—The purpose of this Act is to identify

23	(e) Consultations.—In implementing this Act, the

12	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.							
13	This Act may be cited as the "Colorado Northern Front							
14	$Range\ Mountain\ Backdrop\ Protection\ Study\ Act".$							
15	SEC. 2. PURPOSE.							
16	The purpose of this Act is to identify options that may							
17	be available to assist in maintaining the open space charac-							
18	teristics of land that is part of the mountain backdrop of							
19	communities in the northern section of the Front Range							
20	area of Colorado.							
21	SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.							
22	In this Act:							
23	(1) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means							
24	the Secretary of Agriculture, acting through the Chief							
25	of the Forest Service.							

1	(2) State.—The term "State" means the State
2	of Colorado.
3	(3) Study area.—
4	(A) In general.—The term "study area"
5	means the land in southern Boulder, northern
6	Jefferson, and northern Gilpin Counties, Colo-
7	rado, that is located west of Colorado State
8	Highway 93, south and east of Colorado State
9	Highway 119, and north of Colorado State
10	Highway 46, as generally depicted on the map
11	entitled "Colorado Northern Front Range Moun-
12	tain Backdrop Protection Study Act: Study
13	Area" and dated August 27, 2008.
14	(B) Exclusions.—The term "study area"
15	does not include land within the city limits of
16	the cities of Arvada, Boulder, or Golden, Colo-
17	rado.
18	(4) Undeveloped Land.—The term "undevel-
19	oped land" means land—
20	(A) that is located within the study area;
21	(B) that is free or primarily free of struc-
22	tures; and
23	(C) the development of which is likely to af-
24	fect adversely the scenic, wildlife, or recreational
25	value of the study area.

1	SEC. 4. COLORADO NORTHERN FRONT RANGE MOUNTAIN					
2	BACKDROP STUDY.					
3	(a) Study, Report.—Not later than 1 year after the					
4	date of enactment of this Act and except as provided in					
5	subsection (c), the Secretary shall—					
6	(1) conduct a study of the land within the stud					
7	area; and					
8	(2) complete a report that—					
9	(A) identifies the present ownership of the					
10	land within the study area;					
11	(B) identifies any undeveloped land that					
12	may be at risk of development; and					
13	(C) describes any actions that could be					
14	taken by the United States, the State, a political					
15	subdivision of the State, or any other parties to					
16	preserve the open and undeveloped character of					
17	the land within the study area.					
18	(b) Requirements.—The Secretary shall conduct the					
19	study and develop the report under subsection (a) with the					
20	support and participation of 1 or more of the following					
21	State and local entities:					
22	(1) The Colorado Department of Natural Re-					
23	sources.					
24	(2) Colorado State Forest Service.					
25	(3) Colorado State Conservation Board.					
26	(4) Great Outdoors Colorado.					

1	(5) Boulder, Jefferson, and Gilpin Counties, Col-
2	or ado.
3	(c) Limitation.—If the State and local entities speci-
4	fied in subsection (b) do not support and participate in
5	the conduct of the study and the development of the report
6	under this section, the Secretary may—
7	(1) decrease the area covered by the study area,
8	as appropriate; or
9	(2)(A) opt not to conduct the study or develop
10	the report; and
11	(B) submit to the Committee on Energy and
12	Natural Resources of the Senate and the Committee
13	on Natural Resources of the House of Representatives
14	notice of the decision not to conduct the study or de-
15	velop the report.
16	(d) Effect.—Nothing in this Act authorizes the Sec-
17	retary to take any action that would affect the use of any
18	land not owned by the United States.

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
