

## **H. Res. 223**

### ***In the House of Representatives, U. S.,***

*May 14, 2007.*

Whereas the death of a loved one is a devastating experience,  
and the murder of a loved one is exceptionally difficult;

Whereas the friends and families of murder victims cope with  
grief through a variety of support services, including  
counseling, crisis intervention, professional referrals, and  
assistance in dealing with the criminal justice system;  
and

Whereas the designation of a National Day of Remembrance  
For Murder Victims on September 25th of each year pro-  
vides an opportunity for the people of the United States  
to honor the memories of murder victims and to recog-  
nize the impact on surviving family members: Now, there-  
fore, be it

*Resolved*, That the House of Representatives—

(1) supports the goals and ideals of a National Day  
of Remembrance for Murder Victims; and

(2) recognizes the significant benefits of the organizations that provide services to the loved ones of murder victims.
