A BILL

To provide for the disposition of the Federal property located in Anne Arundel County, Maryland, a portion of which is currently used by the District of Columbia as the Oak Hill juvenile detention facility.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. DISPOSITION OF OAK HILL PROPERTY.
- 4 (a) In General.—The Oak Hill property shall be
- 5 disposed of as follows:
- 6 (1) The portion of the property which is located
- 7 west of the Baltimore-Washington Parkway shall be
- 8 transferred to the jurisdiction of the Director of the

- National Park Service, who shall use such portion
 for parkland purposes.
- 3 (2) Subject to subsection (b), the portion of the 4 property which is located east of the Baltimore-5 Washington Parkway and 200 feet and further 6 north of the Patuxent River shall be transferred to 7 the Secretary of the Army (acting through the Chief 8 of Engineers) for use by the Director of the National Security Agency.
 - (3) The portion of the property which is located east of the Baltimore-Washington Parkway and south of the portion described in paragraph (2) shall be transferred to the jurisdiction of the Administrator of General Services, who shall in turn convey such portion to Anne Arundel County, Maryland, in accordance with subsection (c).
- 17 (b) Payment for Construction of New Juve-18 Nile Detention Facility for District of Colum-19 Bia.—As a condition of the transfer under subsection 20 (a)(2), the Director of the National Security Agency shall 21 enter into an agreement with the Mayor of the District 22 of Columbia under which—
- 23 (1) the juvenile detention facility for the Dis-24 trict of Columbia currently located on the Oak Hill 25 property shall be closed; and

5	(c) Conveyance of Portion of Property to
6	ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY.—
7	(1) In General.—The Administrator of Gen-
8	eral Services shall convey, without consideration, to

11	of the Oak Hill property referred to in subsection

14	ANCE.—The conveyance under paragraph (1) shall

6 recreational use.

7 SEC. 2. OAK HILL PROPERTY DEFINED.

In this Act, the term "Oak Hill property" means the Federal property consisting of approximately 800 acres near Laurel, Maryland, a portion of which is currently used by the District of Columbia as a juvenile detention facility, and which is shown on Map Number 20 in the records of the Department of Assessments and Taxation, Tax Map Division, of Anne Arundel County.
