Mr. OBAMA (for himself, Mr. DURBIN, and Mrs. CLINTON) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation

A BILL

To direct the Consumer Product Safety Commission to classify certain children's products containing lead to be banned hazardous substances.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Lead Free Toys Act
5 of 2007”.

6 **SEC. 2. BAN ON CHILDREN'S PRODUCTS CONTAINING LEAD.**

7 (a) BANNED HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES.—Not later
8 than 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act,
9 the Consumer Product Safety Commission (referred to in

1 this Act as the “Commission”) shall prescribe regulations
2 classifying any children’s product containing lead to be a
3 banned hazardous substance within the meaning of section
4 2(q)(1) of the Hazardous Substances Act (15 U.S.C.
5 1261(q)(1)).

6 (b) DEFINITION OF CHILDREN’S PRODUCT CON-
7 TAINING LEAD.—As used in subsection (a), the term
8 “children’s product containing lead” means any consumer
9 product marketed for use by children under age 6, or
10 whose substantial use by children under age 6 is foresee-
11 able, and containing more than trace amounts of lead, as
12 determined by the Commission and prescribed in the regu-
13 lations required by subsection (a).

14 (c) CERTAIN ELECTRONIC DEVICES.—If, in pre-
15 scribing the regulations required by subsection (a), the
16 Commission determines that it is not feasible for certain
17 electronic devices to comply with such regulations at the
18 time the regulations shall take effect, the Commission
19 shall, by regulation—

20 (1) issue standards to reduce the exposure of
21 and accessibility to lead in such electronic devices;
22 and

- 1 (2) establish a schedule by which such elec-
- 2 tronic devices shall be in full compliance with the
- 3 regulations prescribed under subsection (a).
