# A BILL

To prohibit the Secretary of Agriculture from allowing the importation of certain cattle and beef from Canada until the implementation of country of origin labeling requirements.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled.*

3 SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON IMPORTATION OF CATTLE  
4 FROM CANADA.

5 Notwithstanding any other provision of law (includ-  
6 ing regulations), the Secretary of Agriculture may not per-  
7 mit the importation from Canada of live Canadian cattle  
8 over 30 months of age, or beef derived from Canadian cat-

1 tle over 30 months of age, until the date of implementation  
2 of subtitle D of the Agricultural Marketing Act of 1946  
3 (7 U.S.C. 1638 et seq.).
