- 4 SEC. 2. FCC MAY REGARD SINGLE WORD OR IMAGE AS IN-
- 5 DECENT.
- 6 Section 16 of the Public Telecommunications Act of
- 7 1992 (47 U.S.C. 303 note) is amended by adding at the
- 8 end thereof the following:
- 9 "(c) Single Word or Image Policy.—In admin-
- 10 istering the regulations promulgated under subsection (a),
- 11 the Commission shall maintain a policy that a single word
- 12 or image may constitute indecent programming.".
