AN ACT

To require periodic reports on claims related to acts of terrorism against Americans perpetrated or supported by the Government of Libya.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. PERIODIC REPORTS ON CLAIMS RELATED TO**
2 **ACTS OF TERRORISM AGAINST AMERICANS**
3 **PERPETRATED OR SUPPORTED BY THE GOV-**
4 **ERNMENT OF LIBYA.**

5 (a) **REPORTS REQUIRED.—**

6 (1) **IN GENERAL.**—Not later than 60 days after
7 the date of enactment of this Act, and every 180
8 days thereafter until December 31, 2009, or the Sec-
9 retary of State makes the certification under sub-
10 section (b), the Secretary of State shall submit to
11 the appropriate congressional committees a report
12 on unresolved claims by nationals of the United
13 States against the Government of Libya for acts de-
14 scribed in section 1605(a)(7) of title 28, United
15 States Code.

16 (2) **CONTENT.**—Each report submitted under
17 paragraph (1) shall include—

18 (A) information on the status of negotia-
19 tions between the Government of Libya and the
20 United States claimants;

21 (B) a description of the specific actions
22 that the United States Government is taking to
23 encourage the Government of Libya to resolve
24 such claims; and

25 (C) any other information that the Sec-
26 retary of State considers appropriate.

1 (b) CERTIFICATION.—The certification referred to in
2 paragraph (1) of subsection (a) is a certification submitted
3 by the Secretary of State to the appropriate congressional
4 committees that all claims by nationals of the United
5 States described in such paragraph have been resolved.

6 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

13 (B) the Committee on Foreign Affairs, the
14 Committee on Armed Services, and the Com-
15 mittee on Appropriations of the House of Rep-
16 resentatives.
