Mr. NELSON of Florida introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To recognize the Navy UDT–SEAL Museum in Fort Pierce, Florida, as the official national museum of Navy SEALs and their predecessors.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. RECOGNITION OF NAVY UDT-SEAL MUSEUM IN
4 FORT PIERCE, FLORIDA, AS OFFICIAL NA-
5 TIONAL MUSEUM OF NAVY SEALS AND THEIR
6 PREDECESSORS.

7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

15 (5) The Navy UDT-SEAL Museum preserves
16 the legacy of the honor, courage, patriotism, and
17 sacrifices of those Navy SEALs and their prede-
18 cessors who offered their services and who gave their
19 lives in defense of liberty.

20 (6) The Navy UDT-SEAL Museum finances,
21 operations, and collections are managed by UDT-
22 SEAL Museum Association, Inc., a nonprofit organi-
23 zation governed by current and former SEALs and
24 UDTs.

16 (9) The State of Florida, St. Lucie County,
17 Florida, thousands of private donors, and philan-
18 thropic organizations have contributed millions of
19 dollars to build, restore, and expand the Navy
20 UDT-SEAL Museum.

21 (10) The United States Navy and the United
22 States Special Operations Command have provided
23 many of the historical materials and artifacts on dis-
24 play at the Navy UDT-SEAL Museum.

1 (b) RECOGNITION OF NATIONAL MUSEUM.—The
2 Navy UDT—SEAL Museum, located at 3300 North A1A,
3 North Hutchinson Island, in Fort Pierce, Florida, is rec-
4 ognized as the official national museum of Navy SEALs
5 and their predecessors.
