2	MENT RESTORATION REVOLVING FUND.
3	(a) Investment.—Amounts deposited into the Dam-
4	age Assessment and Restoration Revolving Fund of the
5	National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration re-
6	ferred to in title I of Public Law 101–515 under the head-
7	ing "NATIONAL OCEANIC AND ATMOSPHERIC ADMINISTRA-
8	TION" (33 U.S.C. 2706 note) shall be invested by the Sec-
9	retary of the Treasury in interest bearing obligations of
10	the United States to the extent the amounts are not re-
11	quired to meet current withdrawals.
12	(b) Interest.—Interest earned on any investment
13	under subsection (a) shall—
14	(1) be deposited into the Damage Assessment
15	Restoration Revolving Fund; and
16	(2) remain available until expended.

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
