## A BILL

To provide the Secretary of Agriculture with alternatives to comply with the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. STEWARDSHIP END-RESULT CONTRACTING
- 4 PROJECTS.
- 5 Section 8 of the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Act
- 6 of 1978 (16 U.S.C. 2104) is amended—
- 7 (1) by redesignating subsection (h) as sub-
- 8 section (j) and moving that subsection so as to ap-
- 9 pear at the end of the section; and

1	(2) by inserting after subsection (g) the fol-
2	lowing:
3	"(h) Cancellation or Termination Costs.—
4	"(1) In General.—Notwithstanding section
5	304B of the Federal Property and Administrative
6	Services Act of 1949 (41 U.S.C. 254c), the Sec-
7	retary is not required to obligate funds to cover the
8	cost of cancelling a Forest Service stewardship
9	multiyear contract under section 347 of the Depart-
10	ment of the Interior and Related Agencies Appro-
11	priations Act, 1999 (16 U.S.C. 2104 note; section
12	101(e) of division A of Public Law 105–277) until
13	the contract is cancelled.
14	"(2) Funding sources.—The costs of any
15	cancellation or termination of a multiyear steward-
16	ship contract described in paragraph (1) may be
17	paid from—
18	"(A) appropriations originally made avail-
19	able for the performance of the contract con-
20	cerned;
21	"(B) appropriations currently available for
22	procurement of the type of service concerned,
23	and not otherwise obligated; or
24	"(C) funds appropriated for payments for
25	that performance or procurement.

1	"(3) Anti-deficiency act violations.—In a
2	case in which payment or obligation of funds under
3	this subsection would constitute a violation of sec-
4	tion 1341 of title 31, United States Code (commonly
5	known as the 'Anti-Deficiency Act'), the Secretary
6	may—
7	"(A) seek a supplemental appropriation; or
8	"(B) request funds from the permanent
9	judgment appropriation established pursuant to
10	section 1304 of title 31, United States Code.".
