A BILL

To provide for the flexibility of certain disaster relief funds, and for improved evacuation and sheltering during disasters and catastrophes.

22	(3) COVERED AMOUNTS.—The amounts speci-
23	fied in this paragraph are \$1,170,000,000 des-
24	ignated for the State of Louisiana under the hazard

mitigation grant program of the Federal Emergency

Management Agency for damage caused by Hurri cane Katrina or Hurricane Rita.

(4) Expedited transfer of funds.—

- (A) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator shall, as soon as is practicable, transfer the amounts specified in paragraph (3) to the State of Louisiana.
- (B) PROCEDURES.—The Administrator shall, to the extent practicable, identify and implement mechanisms to be applied to all amounts specified in paragraph (3) made available to the State of Louisiana as a result of Hurricane Katrina or Hurricane Rita under the hazard mitigation grant program under section 404 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5170c) that will simplify the requirements of such program and ensure the expedited distribution of such funds under the program, including—
 - (i) creating a programmatic cost-benefit analysis to provide a means of conducting cost-benefit analysis by similar project type, similar geographic factors, and other similarities making group cost-

(ii) developing a streamlined environmental review process to speed the approval of project applications.

(5) Waiver.—

(A) In General.—Except as provided in subparagraph (B), in using amounts described in paragraph (3), the President shall waive any requirements of section 206.434(c)(5) of title 44, Code of Federal Regulations, that the President determines are inconsistent with paragraph (4)(B) of this subsection and the requirements of section 206.438(d) of title 44, Code of Federal Regulations, or specify alternative requirements, upon request by the State of Louisiana that such waiver is required to facilitate the timely use of funds or a guarantee provided under section 404 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5170c).

(B) EXCEPTION.—The President may not waive any requirement relating to fair housing,

1	nondiscrimination, labor standards, or the envi-
2	ronment under subparagraph (A).
3	(C) APPROVED PROJECTS.—Notwith-
4	standing any waiver of section 206.438(d) of
5	title 44, Code of Federal Regulations, under
6	this paragraph, an individual grant recipient
7	may receive funds from amounts described in
8	paragraph (3) before performance of the project
9	for which that individual is seeking a grant if,
10	before such funds are made available to that in-
11	dividual—
12	(i) the Administrator approves the
13	project for which that individual is seeking
14	a grant;
15	(ii) the State grant recipient certifies
16	to the Administrator that the grant award
17	shall be used in the performance of the
18	project approved under clause (i); and
19	(iii) that individual grant recipient
20	certifies to the State grant recipient that
21	the grant award shall be used in the per-
22	formance of the project approved under
23	clause (i).
24	(D) CERTIFICATIONS.—

- (i) IN GENERAL.—After the expenditure of all funds under a grant described in subparagraph (C), the individual grant recipient shall submit a certification to the State grant recipient regarding whether the funds were used in the performance of the applicable project approved under subparagraph (C)(i).
 - (ii) TO THE ADMINISTRATOR.—Upon receipt of a certification under clause (i), the State shall submit a certification to the Administrator regarding whether the funds were used in the performance of the applicable project approved under subparagraph (C)(i).
 - (E) AUDITING.—The Administrator may design and implement audit procedures and requirements as necessary and appropriate to carry out this paragraph.
- 20 (b) REPORTING REQUIREMENT.—The Administrator 21 shall provide annual reports to the Committee on Home-22 land Security and Governmental Affairs of the Senate and 23 the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure of 24 the House of Representatives on—

5	SEC. 4. EVACUATION AND SHELTERING.
6	(a) REGIONAL EVACUATION AND SHELTERING
7	Plans.—
8	(1) In general.—Not later than 360 days
9	after the date of enactment of this Act, the Adminis-
10	trator, in coordination with the heads of appropriate
11	Federal agencies with responsibilities under the Na-
12	tional Response Plan or any successor plan, States,
13	local governments, and appropriate nongovernmental
14	organizations, shall develop and submit to Congress,
15	regional evacuation and sheltering plans that—
16	(A) address national interstate major dis-
17	asters or emergencies;
18	(B) incorporate all appropriate modes of
19	transportation, including interstate rail, com-
20	mercial rail, commercial air, military transpor-
21	tation, and commercial bus;
22	(C) clearly define the roles and responsibil-
23	ities of Federal, State, and local governments in
24	the evacuation plan; and

- 1 (D) identify regional and national shelters
 2 capable of housing evacuees and victims of an
 3 emergency or major disaster in any part of the
 4 United States.
- 5 (2) IMPLEMENTATION.—After developing the 6 plans described in paragraph (1), the Administrator 7 and the head of any Federal agency with responsibil-8 ities under those plans shall take necessary meas-9 ures to be able to implement those plans, including 10 conducting exercises under such plans as appro-11 priate.
- 12 (b) NATIONAL SHELTERING DATABASE.—The Ad13 ministrator, in coordination with States, local govern14 ments, and appropriate nongovernmental entities, shall de15 velop a national database inventorying available shelters,
 16 that can be shared with States and local governments.

(c) Protection Strategy.—

(1) In General.—As soon as is practicable, the Administrator, in consultation with the heads of appropriate Federal agencies with responsibilities under the National Response Plan or any successor plan, shall conduct an analysis comparing the costs, benefits, and health and safety concerns of evacuating individuals with special needs during an emergency or major disaster, as compared to the costs,

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1	benefits, and health and safety concerns of shel-
2	tering such people in the area they are located when
3	that emergency or major disaster occurs.
4	(2) Considerations.—In conducting the anal-
5	ysis under paragraph (1), the Administrator shall
6	consider—
7	(A) areas with populations of not less than
8	20,000 individual needing medical assistance or
9	lacking the ability to self evacuate;
10	(B) areas that do not have an all hazards
11	resistance shelter; and
12	(C) the health and safety of individuals
13	with special needs.
14	(3) Technical assistance.—The Adminis-
15	trator shall, as appropriate, provide technical assist-
16	ance to States and local governments in developing
17	and exercising evacuation and sheltering plans,
18	which identify and use regional shelters, manpower,
19	logistics, physical facilities, and modes of transpor-
20	tation to be used to evacuate and shelter large
21	groups of people.
22	(d) Evacuation Traffic Information System.—
23	(1) In General.—The Administrator, in co-
24	ordination with the heads of appropriate Federal

agencies with responsibilities under the National Re-

sponse Plan or any successor plan, shall obtain and share information with State, local, regional, and tribal governments on evacuation statistics and monitoring from the Evacuation Traffic Information System of the Department of Transportation and other transportation data for planning purposes.

(2) Report.—

- (A) In GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General of the United States shall submit to Congress a report assessing the need to update the Evacuation Traffic Information System to adequately address the needs of State, local, regional, and tribal governments, which shall include recommendations, if any.
- (B) Consultation.—In preparing the report submitted under subparagraph (A), the Comptroller General shall seek input from appropriate Federal, State, local, regional, and tribal government officials.

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
