5	(a) Authority.—Notwithstanding any other provi				
6	sion of law, the Secretary of Defense may transfer the				
7	amount of any congressionally directed spending item in				
8	or in connection with the Department of Defense Appro				
9	priations Act, 2008 (division A of Public Law 110–116				
10	to one or more of the accounts specified in subsection (b				
11	for purposes of operations and activities in Iraq or Af				
12	ghanistan.				
13	(b) COVERED ACCOUNTS.—The accounts specified in				
14	this subsection are the accounts as follows:				
15	(1) The accounts of the Department of De				
16	fense.				
17	(2) The accounts of the Department of State.				
18	(3) The accounts of the United States Agency

20	(4) The account of any other department or

25	(c) Effect of Transfer.—				

- 1 (1) Merger with account to which trans-2 FERRED.—Any amount transferred under subsection 3 (a) to an account specified in subsection (b) shall be merged with amounts in such account that are avail-5 able for operations or activities in Iraq or Afghani-6 stan, and shall available for the same purposes, and 7 subject to the same conditions and limitations, as 8 amounts in such account that are available for oper-9 ations or activities in Iraq or Afghanistan.
  - (2) Effect on accounts.—A transfer of an amount under subsection (a) to an account specified in subsection (b) shall be deemed to increase the amount provided for such account by an amount equal to the amount transferred.
  - (3) TERMINATION OF CONGRESSIONAL DI-RECTED SPENDING ITEM.—Upon the transfer under subsection (a) of the amount of a congressionally directed spending item, the budget authority, credit authority, or other spending authority for such item in the amount as so directed shall have no further force or effect.
- 22 (d) Congressionally Directed Spending Item 23 Defined.—In this section, the term "congressionally di-24 rected spending item" means a provision or report lan-25 guage included primarily at the request of a Member of

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- 1 Congress providing, authorizing, or recommending a spe-
- 2 cific amount of discretionary budget authority, credit au-
- 3 thority, or other spending authority for a contract, loan,
- 4 loan guarantee, grant, loan authority, or other expenditure
- 5 with or to an entity, or targeted to a specific State, local-
- 6 ity, or Congressional district other than through a statu-
- 7 tory or administrative formula-driven or competitive
- 8 award process.

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
