# A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Director of the National Park Service, to designate the Dr. Norman E. Borlaug Birthplace and Childhood Home in Cresco, Iowa, as a National Historic Site and as a unit of the National Park System, and for other purposes.

3 SECTION 1. DR. NORMAN E. BORLAUG BIRTHPLACE AND  
4 HOME NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE

## 5 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

5 (2) NORMAN E. BORLAUG PROPERTY.—The  
6 term “Norman E. Borlaug property” means—

10 (B) the Norman E. Borlaug Childhood  
11 Home site, located at 19518 200th Street,  
12 Cresco, Iowa; and

13 (C) any personal property relating to—

14 (i) the Norman E. Borlaug Birthplace  
15 site; and

16 (ii) the Norman E. Borlaug Childhood  
17 Home site.

21 (b) ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY; DESIGNATION OF  
22 NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE.—If the Secretary acquires, by  
23 donation, from the Norman Borlaug Heritage Foundation,  
24 fee simple and unencumbered title to the Norman E.

1 Borlaug property, the Secretary shall designate the prop-  
2 erty as—

3 (1) a National Historic Site, to be known as the  
4 “Dr. Norman E. Borlaug Birthplace and Home Na-  
5 tional Historic Site”; and

6 (2) a unit of the National Park System.

7 (c) ADMINISTRATION.—The Secretary shall admin-  
8 ister the Historic Site in accordance with applicable laws  
9 (including regulations), including—

10 (1) the National Park Service Organic Act (16  
11 U.S.C. 1 et seq.); and

12 (2) the Act of August 21, 1935 (16 U.S.C. 461  
13 et seq.).
