### A BILL

To authorize the National Guard to provide support for the border control activities of the United States Customs and Border Protection of the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. NATIONAL GUARD SUPPORT FOR BORDER CON-
- 4 TROL ACTIVITIES.
- 5 (a) Operation Jump Start.—

- 1 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not fewer than 6,000 Na2 tional Guard personnel shall continue to be deployed
  3 along the international border between the United
  4 States and Mexico under Operation Jump Start
  5 until the date on which the Federal Government has
  6 achieved operational control of such border (as de7 fined in section 2(b) of the Secure Fence Act of
  8 2006 (Public Law 109–367)).
  - (2) Exemption.—National Guard personnel deployed pursuant to paragraph (1) shall not be included in the calculation to determine compliance with—
- (A) limits on end strength; or
- 14 (B) limits on the number of National
  15 Guard personal that may be placed on active
  16 duty for operational support.
- 17 (b) Support Authorized.—Chapter 1 of title 32,
- 18 United States Code, is amended by inserting after section
- 19 112 the following:

#### 20 "§ 112a. Border control activities

- 21 "(a) Funding Assistance.—The Secretary of De-
- 22 fense may provide funds to the Governor of a State who
- 23 submits to the Secretary a State border control activities
- 24 plan satisfying the requirements of subsection (c). Such
- 25 funds shall be used for the following:

- "(1) The pay, allowances, clothing, subsistence, gratuities, travel, and related expenses, as authorized by State law, of personnel of the National Guard of that State used, while not in Federal service, for the purpose of border control activities.
  - "(2) The operation and maintenance of the equipment and facilities of the National Guard of that State used for the purpose of border control activities.
- "(3) The procurement of services and equipment, and the leasing of equipment, for the National
  Guard of that State used for the purpose of border
  control activities. However, the use of such funds for
  the procurement of equipment may not exceed
  \$5,000 per item, unless approval for procurement of
  equipment in excess of that amount is granted in advance by the Secretary of Defense.

  "(b) USE OF PERSONNEL PERFORMING FULL-TIME

  NATIONAL GUARD DUTY.—(1) Under regulations prescribed by the Secretary of Defense, personnel of the National Guard of a State may, in accordance with the State
  border control activities plan referred to in subsection (c),
  be ordered to perform full-time National Guard duty
  under section 502(f) of this title for the purpose of carrying out border control activities.

- 1 "(2)(A) A member of the National Guard serving on
- 2 full-time National Guard duty under orders authorized
- 3 under paragraph (1) shall participate in the training re-
- 4 quired under section 502(a) of this title in addition to the
- 5 duty performed for the purpose authorized under that
- 6 paragraph. The pay, allowances, and other benefits of the
- 7 member while participating in the training shall be the
- 8 same as those to which the member is entitled while per-
- 9 forming duty for the purpose of carrying out border con-
- 10 trol activities. The member is not entitled to additional
- 11 pay, allowances, or other benefits for participation in
- 12 training required under section 502(a)(1) of this title.
- 13 "(B) Appropriations available for the Department of
- 14 Defense for homeland defense may be used for paying
- 15 costs associated with a member's participation in training
- 16 described in subparagraph (A). The appropriation shall be
- 17 reimbursed in full, out of appropriations available for pay-
- 18 ing those costs, for the amounts paid. Appropriations
- 19 available for paying those costs shall be available for mak-
- 20 ing the reimbursements.
- 21 "(C) To ensure that the use of units and personnel
- 22 of the National Guard of a State pursuant to a State bor-
- 23 der control activities plan does not degrade the training
- 24 and readiness of such units and personnel, the following
- 25 requirements shall apply in determining the border control

- activities that units and personnel of the National Guard 2 of a State may perform: 3 "(i) The performance of the activities may not adversely affect the quality of that training or other-5 wise interfere with the ability of a member or unit 6 of the National Guard to perform the military func-7 tions of the member or unit. 8 "(ii) National Guard personnel will not degrade 9 their military skills as a result of performing the ac-10 tivities. 11 "(iii) The performance of the activities will not 12 result in a significant increase in the cost of train-13 ing. 14 "(iv) In the case of border control activities per-15 formed by a unit organized to serve as a unit, the 16 activities will support valid unit training require-17 ments.
- 18 "(c) Plan Requirements.—A State border control19 activities plan shall—
- "(1) specify how personnel of the National Guard of that State are to be used in border control activities in support of the mission of the United States Customs and Border Protection of the Department of Homeland Security;

- 1 "(2) certify that those operations are to be conducted at a time when the personnel involved are not in Federal service;
  - "(3) certify that participation by National Guard personnel in those operations is service in addition to training required under section 502 of this title;
    - "(4) certify that any engineer-type activities (as defined by the Secretary of Defense) under the plan will be performed only by units and members of the National Guard;
    - "(5) include a certification by the Attorney General of the State (or, in the case of a State with no position of Attorney General, a civilian official of the State equivalent to a State attorney general) that the use of the National Guard of the State for the activities proposed under the plan is authorized by, and is consistent with, State law; and
    - "(6) certify that the Governor of the State or a civilian law enforcement official of the State designated by the Governor has determined that any activities included in the plan that are carried out in conjunction with Federal law enforcement agencies serve a State law enforcement purpose.
