# S. 2724

To amend the National Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards Act of 1974 to require that weather radios be installed in all manufactured homes manufactured or sold in the United States.

# A BILL

- To amend the National Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards Act of 1974 to require that weather radios be installed in all manufactured homes manufactured or sold in the United States.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "CJ's Home Protection
  - 5 Act of 2008".
  - 6 SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL FINDINGS.
  - 7 The Congress finds that—

- 1 (1) nearly 20,000,000 Americans live in manu-2 factured homes, which often provide a more acces-3 sible and affordable way for many families to buy 4 their own homes;
  - (2) manufactured housing plays a vital role in providing housing for low- and moderate-income families in the United States;
  - (3) NOAA Weather Radio (NWR) is a nation-wide network of radio stations broadcasting continuous weather information directly from a nearby National Weather Service (NWS) office, and broadcasts NWS warnings, watches, forecasts, and other all-hazard information 24 hours a day;
  - (4) the operators of manufactured housing communities should be encouraged to provide a safe place of shelter for community residents or a plan for the evacuation of community residents to a safe place of shelter within a reasonable distance of the community for use by community residents in times of severe weather, including tornados and high winds, and local municipalities should be encouraged to require approval of these plans;
  - (5) the operators of manufactured housing communities should be encouraged to provide a written reminder semiannually to all owners of manufac-

1	tured homes in the manufactured housing commu-
2	nity to replace the batteries in their weather radios;
3	and
4	(6) weather radio manufacturers should include,
5	in the packaging of weather radios, a written re-
6	minder to replace the batteries twice each year and
7	written instructions on how to do so.
8	SEC. 3. FEDERAL MANUFACTURED HOME INSTALLATION
9	STANDARDS.
10	Section 605 of the National Manufactured Housing
11	Construction and Safety Standards Act of 1974 (42
12	U.S.C. 5404) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
13	lowing new subsection:
14	"(d) Weather Radios.—
15	"(1) Provision of Installation Instruc-
16	TIONS.—A manufacturer shall provide with each
17	manufactured home (other than a manufactured
18	home affixed to a permanent foundation), instruc-
19	tions for the installation of a weather radio required
20	under this section.
21	"(2) Model installation standards.—The
22	Federal manufactured home installation standards
23	established by the Secretary under this section shall
24	require that each manufactured home (other than a

manufactured home affixed to a permanent founda-

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1	tion) shall be installed with a weather radio inside
2	the manufactured home that—
3	"(A) is capable of broadcasting emergency
4	information relating to local weather conditions;
5	"(B) is equipped with a tone alarm;
6	"(C) is equipped with Specific Alert Mes-
7	sage Encoding, or SAME technology; and
8	"(D) complies with Consumer Electronics
9	Association (CEA) Standard 2009-A (or cur-
10	rent revision thereof) Performance Specification
11	for Public Alert Receivers.
12	"(3) Responsibility of manufactured
13	HOME INSTALLERS.—It shall be the duty of manu-
14	factured home installers to ensure that manufac-
15	tured homes (other than manufactured homes af-
16	fixed to a permanent foundation) are supplied and
17	installed with a weather radio required under this
18	subsection.
19	"(4) Definition of Affixed to a Perma-
20	NENT FOUNDATION.—For purposes of this sub-
21	section, the term 'affixed to a permanent foundation'
22	has the meaning given that term in the Department
23	of Housing and Urban Development's publication
24	entitled 'Permanent Foundations Guide For Manu-
25	factured Housing' dated September 1996.

## "(5) Liability Protections.—

"(A) Immunity for manufactured homes shall be immune from common law civil liability for any aspect of the installation, furnishing, function, operation, performance, capabilities, or utilization of the weather radio mandated by the Federal manufactured home installation standards promulgated in accordance with this subsection, including any instructions related thereto.

"(B) IMMUNITY FOR INSTALLERS.—Manufactured home installers shall be immune from common law civil liability for any aspect of the installation, furnishing, function, operation, performance, capabilities, or utilization of the weather radio mandated by the Federal manufactured home installation standards promulgated in accordance with this subsection, including any instructions related thereto.

"(C) Immunity for retailers.—Retailers of manufactured homes shall be immune from common law civil liability for any aspect of the installation, furnishing, function, operation, performance, capabilities, or utilization of the weather radio mandated by the Federal

manufactured home installation standards promulgated in accordance with this subsection, including any instructions related thereto.

"(D) IMMUNITY FOR OPERATORS OF HOUSING COMMUNITIES.—Any reminder, assistance, or instructions provided by the operator of a manufactured housing community concerning the function of a weather radio contained in a manufactured home shall not subject the operator, an owner or employee of the manufactured home community, or the manufacturer of the manufactured home to liability for the functionality of that weather radio.

### "(6) Exemption for modular homes.—

- "(A) IN GENERAL.—The installation standards required to be established under paragraph (2) shall not apply to modular homes.
- "(B) DEFINITION OF MODULAR HOME.—
  For purposes of this paragraph, the term 'modular home' has the meaning given such term in the law of the State in which the modular home is located.".

#### SEC. 4. ESTABLISHMENT.

- 2 Not later than the expiration of the 90-day period
- 3 beginning on the date of the enactment of this Act, the
- 4 consensus committee established pursuant to section
- 5 604(a)(3) of the National Manufactured Housing Con-
- 6 struction and Safety Standards Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C.
- 7 5304(a)(3)) shall develop and submit to the Secretary of
- 8 Housing and Urban Development a proposed Federal
- 9 manufactured home installation standards required under
- 10 section 605(d) of such Act (as added by the amendment
- 11 made by section 3 of this Act). Notwithstanding section
- 12 604(a)(5)(B) of such Act, the Secretary of Housing and
- 13 Urban Development shall issue a final order promulgating
- 14 the standard required by such section 605(i) not later
- 15 than the expiration of the 90-day period beginning upon
- 16 receipt by the Secretary of the proposed standard devel-
- 17 oped and submitted by the consensus committee.

#### 18 **SEC. 5. STUDY.**

- 19 The Secretary of Housing and Urban Development
- 20 shall conduct a study regarding conditioning the applica-
- 21 bility of the requirement under the amendment made by
- 22 section 3 of this Act (relating to the installation of weather
- 23 radios in manufactured homes) on the geographic location
- 24 at which a manufactured home is placed, but only to the
- 25 extent that such requirement applies to new manufactured
- 26 homes and new site-built homes. In conducting such study

- 1 and making determinations under to the study, the Sec-
- 2 retary shall take into consideration severe weather condi-
- 3 tions, such as high winds and flooding, and wind zones
- 4 and other severe weather data available from the National
- 5 Weather Service. Not later than the expiration of the 18-
- 6 month period beginning on the date of the enactment of
- 7 this Act, the Secretary shall complete the study and sub-
- 8 mit a report regarding the results of the study to the Com-
- 9 mittee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs of the
- 10 Senate and to the Committee on Financial Services of the
- 11 House of Representatives.

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
