A BILL

To prioritize the provision of assistance to combat HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, and malaria to in-need countries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON PROVISION OF ASSISTANCE

TO COMBAT HIV/AIDS, TUBERCULOSIS, AND

MALARIA TO COUNTRIES WITH SPACE EXPLORATION AND NUCLEAR PROGRAMS.

The Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2151)

et seq.) is amended by inserting after section 104C the

following new section:

1	"SEC. 104D. PROHIBITION ON PROVISION OF ASSISTANCE
2	TO COMBAT HIV/AIDS, TUBERCULOSIS, AND
3	MALARIA TO COUNTRIES WITH SPACE EXPLO-
4	RATION AND NUCLEAR PROGRAMS.
5	"None of the funds appropriated or otherwise made
6	available pursuant to section 104A, section 104B, or sec-
7	tion 104C may be expended in a fiscal year in a country
8	if the Secretary of State determines that during the pre-
9	vious fiscal year the government of such country expended
10	funds from its own budget on developing or sustaining an
11	active program for space exploration and research or for
12	nuclear weapon design, development, or maintenance.".
