A BILL

To require that citizens within a National Heritage Area are informed of the designation and that government officials must receive permission to enter private property.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “No Trespassing Act
5 of 2008”.

1 **SEC. 2. NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENT.**

2 The Secretary of the Interior shall not approve a
3 management plan for a National Heritage Area unless the
4 local coordinating entity of the proposed National Herit-
5 age Area provides written notification through the United
6 States mail of the designation to each individual who re-
7 sides, or owns property that is located, in the proposed
8 National Heritage Area.

9 **SEC. 3. WRITTEN CONSENT REQUIREMENT.**

10 With respect to each National Heritage Area, no em-
11 ployee of the National Park Service or member of the local
12 coordinating entity of the National Heritage Area (includ-
13 ing any designee of the National Park Service or the local
14 coordinating entity) may enter a parcel of private property
15 located in the National Heritage Area without the written
16 consent of the owner of the parcel of property.
