- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Do No Harm Act of
- 5 2008".

1	SEC. 2. GUARANTEE OF NO ADVERSE AFFECTS TO CITI-
2	ZENS AS A RESULT OF A NATIONAL HERIT-
3	AGE AREA DESIGNATION.
4	Each National Heritage Area designation shall not
5	take effect until the date on which the President certifies
6	that—
7	(1) the designation of each proposed National
8	Heritage Area will not cause an adverse impact on—
9	(A) agricultural or livestock production
10	within the proposed National Heritage Area;
11	(B) energy exploration and production
12	within the proposed National Heritage Area;
13	(C) critical infrastructure located within
14	the proposed National Heritage Area, including
15	the placement and maintenance of—
16	(i) electric transmission and distribu-
17	tion lines (including related infrastruc-
18	ture); and
19	(ii) natural gas pipelines (including
20	related infrastructure); and
21	(D) the affordability of housing; and
22	(2) with respect to each State in which there is
23	located a proposed National Heritage Area, the total
24	deferred maintenance backlog of the State is an
25	amount not greater than \$50,000,000, as reported

- 2 Federal Accounting Standards Advisory Board.
