A BILL

For the relief of Ross E. Lay of Haiku, Hawaii.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. REIMBURSEMENT OF AMOUNTS PAID TO THE
- 4 INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE.
- 5 (a) In General.—The Secretary of the Treasury
- 6 shall pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise
- 7 appropriated, to Mr. Ross E. Lay of Haiku, Hawaii, the
- 8 sum of \$101,710.23 for reimbursement for amounts paid
- 9 to the Internal Revenue Service on September 10, 2002,
- 10 at a sale of real estate in Moultonboro, New Hampshire,
- 11 to obtain property of which Ross E. Lay was unable to

- 1 take possession due to previous encumbrances against the
- 2 property not disclosed by the Internal Revenue Service.
- 3 (b) No Inference of Liability.—Nothing in this
- 4 section shall be construed as an inference of liability on
- 5 the part of the United States.
- 6 (c) Full Satisfaction of Claims.—The payment
- 7 authorized under subsection (a) shall be in full satisfaction
- 8 of all claims of Ross E. Lay against the United States
- 9 for reimbursement of amounts paid for or in connection
- 10 with the sale of real estate by the Internal Revenue Service
- 11 in Moultonboro, New Hampshire, on September 10, 2002.
- 12 (d) Limitation on Agents and Attorneys
- 13 Fees.—No more than 10 percent of the payment author-
- 14 ized by this Act may be paid to or received by any agent
- 15 or attorney for services rendered in connection with ob-
- 16 taining such payment, any contract to the contrary not-
- 17 withstanding. Any person who violates this subsection
- 18 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to
- 19 a fine in the amount provided in title 18, United States
- 20 Code.
