## A BILL

To establish a servitude and emancipation archival research clearinghouse in the National Archives.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Servitude and Emanci-
- 5 pation Archival Research ClearingHouse Act" or the
- 6 "SEARCH Act".

1	SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF NATIONAL ARCHIVES DATA-
2	BASE OF HISTORIC RECORDS REGARDING
3	SERVITUDE AND EMANCIPATION.
4	(a) In General.—The Archivist of the United
5	States shall establish, as a part of the National Archives,
6	a national database consisting of historic records of ser-
7	vitude and emancipation in the United States to assist Af-
8	rican Americans in researching their genealogy.
9	(b) Maintenance.—The database shall be main-
10	tained by the National Historical Publications and
11	Records Commission.
12	(c) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
13	are authorized to be appropriated—
14	(1) \$5,000,000 to establish the database; and
15	(2) \$5,000,000 to provide grants to States and
16	colleges and universities to preserve local records of
17	servitude and emancipation.
