A BILL

To provide for a program for circulating quarter dollar coins that are emblematic of a national park or other national site in each State, the District of Columbia, and each territory of the United States, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "America's Beautiful
- 5 National Parks Quarter Dollar Coin Act of 2008".

21	"(D) PARTICIPATION IN DESIGN.—The
22	Secretary may include participation by officials
23	of the State, artists from the State, engravers
24	of the United States Mint, and members of the
25	general public.

2	tant that the Nation's coinage and currency
3	bear dignified designs of which the citizens of
4	the United States can be proud, the Secretary
5	shall not select any frivolous or inappropriate
6	design for any quarter dollar minted under this
7	subsection.
8	"(F) Prohibition on Certain Rep-
9	RESENTATIONS.—No head and shoulders por-
10	trait or bust of any person, living or dead, no
11	portrait of a living person, and no outline or
12	map of a State may be included in the design
13	on the reverse of any quarter dollar under this
14	subsection.
15	"(4) Issuance of coins.—
16	"(A) YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK.—
17	Since Yellowstone National Park was estab-
18	lished by an Act signed by President Ulysses S.
19	Grant on March 1, 1872, as the Nation's first

- "(B) Order of issuance.—Subject to subparagraph (A), the quarter dollar coins issued under this subsection bearing designs of national sites shall be issued in the order in which the sites selected under paragraph (3) were first established as a national site.
 - "(C) Rate of issuance.—The quarter dollar coins bearing designs of national sites under this subsection shall be issued at the rate of 5 new designs during each year of the period of issuance under this subsection.
 - "(D) Number of each of five coin designs in each year.—Of the quarter dollar coins issued during each year of the period of issuance, the Secretary of the Treasury shall prescribe, on the basis of such factors as the Secretary determines to be appropriate, the number of quarter dollars which shall be issued with each of the designs selected for such year.

"(ii) Notice and report.—Within 30 days after making a determination under clause (i), the Secretary shall submit a written report on such determination to the Committee on Financial Services of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs of the Senate.

"(iii) APPLICABILITY OF PROVI-SIONS.—If the Secretary makes a determination under clause (i), the provisions of this subsection applicable to site and design selection and approval, the order, timing, and conditions of issuance shall apply in like manner as the initial issuance of quarter dollars under this subsection, except that the issuance of quarter dollars pursuant to such determination bearing the first design shall commence in order immediately following the last issuance of quarter dollars under the first round.

16	SEC. 201. SILVER BULLION COIN.
17	Section 5112 of title 31, United States Code, is
18	amended by inserting after subsection (t) (as added by
19	section 101 of this Act) the following:
20	"(u) Silver Bullion Investment Product.—
21	"(1) In general.—The Secretary shall strike
22	and make available for sale such number of bullion
23	coins as the Secretary determines to be appropriate
24	that are exact duplicates of the quarter dollars

issued under subsection (t), each of which shall—

1	"(A) have a diameter of 3.0 inches and
2	weigh 5.0 ounces;
3	"(B) contain .999 fine silver;
4	"(C) have incused into the edge the
5	fineness and weight of the bullion coin;
6	"(D) bear an inscription of the denomina-
7	tion of such coin, which shall be 'quarter dol-
8	lar'; and
9	"(E) not be minted or issued by the
10	United States Mint as so-called 'fractional' bul-
11	lion coins or in any size other than the size de-
12	scribed in paragraph (A).
13	"(2) Availability for sale.—Bullion coins
14	minted under paragraph (1)—
15	"(A) shall become available for sale no
16	sooner than the first day of the calendar year
17	in which the circulating quarter dollar of which
18	such bullion coin is a duplicate is issued; and
19	"(B) may only be available for sale during
20	the year in which such circulating quarter dol-
21	lar is issued.
22	"(3) Distribution.—
23	"(A) IN GENERAL.—In addition to the au-
24	thorized dealers utilized by the Secretary in dis-
25	tributing bullion coins and solely for purposes

of distributing bullion coins issued under this subsection, the Director of the National Park Service, or the designee of the Director, may purchase numismatic items issued under this subsection, but only in units of no fewer than 1,000 at a time, and the Director, or the Director's designee, may resell or repackage such numismatic items as the Director determines to be appropriate.

"(B) RESALE.—The Director of the National Park Service, or the designee of the Director, may resell, at cost and without repackaging, numismatic items acquired by the Director or such designee under subparagraph (A) to any party affiliated with any national site honored by a quarter dollar under subsection (t) for repackaging and resale by such party in the same manner and to the same extent as such party would be authorized to engage in such activities under subparagraph (A) if the party were acting as the designee of the Director under such subparagraph.".

- 2 SEC. 301. NO NET COST TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.
- 3 The Secretary of the Treasury shall take such actions
- 4 as are necessary to ensure that minting and issuing coins
- 5 under this Act and the amendments made by this Act will
- 6 not result in any net cost to the Federal Government.
