A BILL

To require the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to permit facilities of the Department of Veterans Affairs to be designated as voter registration agencies, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Veteran Voting Sup-
- 5 port Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress makes the following findings:

- 1 (1) Veterans serving in foreign wars have per-2 formed a great service to, and risked the greatest 3 sacrifice in the name of, our country, and should be 4 supported by the people and the Government of the 5 United States.
 - (2) Veterans are especially qualified to understand issues of war, foreign policy, and government support for veterans, and they should have the opportunity to voice that understanding through voting.
 - (3) The Department of Veterans Affairs should assist veterans in meeting their medical, social, and civic needs, including the full participation of veterans in our democracy.
- 15 (4) The Department of Veterans Affairs should 16 make every effort to assist veterans to register to 17 vote and to vote.

1	(1) In General.—The Secretary of Veterans
2	Affairs shall not prohibit any election administration
3	official, whether State or local, party-affiliated or
4	non-party affiliated, or elected or appointed, from
5	providing voting information to veterans at any facil-
6	ity of the Department of Veterans Affairs.

- (2) Voting information.—In this subsection, the term "voting information" means nonpartisan information intended for the public about voting, including information about voter registration, voting systems, absentee balloting, polling locations, and other important resources for voters.
- 13 (b) VOTER REGISTRATION SERVICES.—The Sec-14 retary shall provide reasonable access to facilities of the 15 Department of Veterans Affairs to State and local election 16 officials for the purpose of providing nonpartisan voter 17 registration services to individuals.

18 SEC. 7. ANNUAL REPORT ON COMPLIANCE.

The Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall submit to Congress an annual report on how the Secretary has complied with the requirements of this Act.
