A BILL

- To limit the use of certain interrogation techniques, to require notification of the International Committee of the Red Cross of detainees, to prohibit interrogation by contractors, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Restoring America's
 - 5 Integrity Act".
 - 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
 - 7 In this Act:

- 1 (1) Instrumentality.—The term "instrumentality", with respect to an element of the intelligence community, means a contractor or subcontractor at any tier of the element of the intelligence community.
- 6 (2) INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY.—The term
 7 "intelligence community" has the meaning given
 8 that term in section 3(4) of the National Security
 9 Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C. 401a(4)).

10 SEC. 3. LIMITATION ON INTERROGATION TECHNIQUES.

- 11 No individual in the custody or under the effective
- 12 control of personnel of an element of the intelligence com-
- 13 munity or instrumentality of an element of the intelligence
- 14 community, regardless of nationality or physical location
- 15 of such individual or personnel, shall be subject to any
- 16 treatment or technique of interrogation not authorized by
- 17 the United States Army Field Manual on Human Intel-
- 18 ligence Collector Operations.

19 SEC. 4. NOTIFICATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL COM-

- 20 MITTEE OF THE RED CROSS.
- 21 (a) REQUIREMENT.—The head of an element of the
- 22 intelligence community or an instrumentality of such ele-
- 23 ment who detains or has custody or effective control of
- 24 an individual shall notify the International Committee of
- 25 the Red Cross of the detention of the individual and pro-

- 1 vide access to such individual in a manner consistent with
- 2 the practices of the Armed Forces.
- 3 (b) Construction.—Nothing in this section shall be 4 construed—
- (1) to create or otherwise imply the authority to
 detain; or
- 7 (2) to limit or otherwise affect any other rights 8 or obligations which may arise under the Geneva 9 Conventions, other international agreements, or 10 other laws, or to state all of the situations under 11 which notification to and access for the International 12 Committee of the Red Cross is required or allowed.
- 13 SEC. 5. PROHIBITION ON INTERROGATIONS BY CONTRAC-
- 14 TORS.

15 The Director of the Central Intelligence Agency may

16 not permit a contractor or subcontractor to the Central

17 Intelligence Agency to carry out an interrogation of an

18 individual. Any interrogation carried out on behalf of the

19 Central Intelligence Agency shall be conducted by an em-

20 ployee of such Agency.
